- According to NOAA's latest economics report, U.S. commercial fishing generated an estimated **\$183 billion** (without imports) and recreational fishing generated an estimated **\$138 billion** in total sales impacts.²
- Fifty fish stocks** have been rebuilt since 2000.³
- US fisheries support **1.6 million** commercial fishing jobs and **692,000** recreational fishing jobs.⁴

The Marine Fish Conservation Network is a coalition of commercial and recreational fishing associations, regional and national conservation groups, aquaria, sustainable seafood suppliers, and marine science organizations dedicated to sustaining abundant fish populations, healthy marine ecosystems, and thriving working waterfront communities through defending and strengthening U.S. ocean and fisheries conservation policies.
